We have also ask the same public Transport question to the South west Transport Board because of the close working together on Public transport.

So I can ask my question on bus service improvements plan and co ordination across South west England.

Question 1

The progress on the Regional bus coach study.

What progress is National highway making of investment in the Trunk road and motorway Network for such routes

as The Falcon coach services.

Between Bristol Bond street, churchill, Brent knoll, Bridgwater, Taunton, Wellington, cullompton, Exeter, Newton About and Plymouth coach station.

And coach station and interchanges facilities on the motorways and Trunk Road Network in the South weste Transport Board area and Weston Gateway transport Board.

For National Express coaches, megabus and Flixbus.

Between London Victoria coach station and Bristol to south west England.

To centre such as Bridgwater, Taunton Wellington Tiverton bus and coach South molton, Barnstaple bus station Ilfracombe and Bideford and Westwood ho.

Cullompton, Exeter, Torquay paignton, Totnes Plymouth coach station,

Liskerd Bodmin, st Austell Newquay bus station, Newquay bus and coach Camborne bus and coachstation, Falmouth the moor and

Penzance. Bus and coach station.

M3 London Victoria to Southampton Ringwood, Bournemouth interchange, Poole coach station, Dorchester and Weymouth.

What input has the South west

Transport Board and western Gateway transport Board had into these interchanges facilities with the public transport operators and National highways.

ANSWER:

Thank you for taking the time to submit a question to our July Board meeting. The Western Gateway Sub-National Transport Body is a strategic body tasked by the Department of Transport with developing regional transport strategies covering different transport modes and content,



working closely with the local authorities to prioritise transport schemes and related funding request to central bodies. As such we do not hold a separate funding pot to develop transport schemes, but guide and advise by collecting evidence and data, to help central Government decide where to make investments in the transport network.

We are currently at an early stage in developing a coach strategy for the region. This is something of a first for the country, as the DfT has only recently turned its attention to coach transport due, in part, to its wholly commercial nature. However, we believe there may be possibilities to develop a genuine coach-based network to cover those areas, regions, towns and villages that do not have good rail links, or fast bus networks, and to offer people an alternative to the use of the private car. I say 'genuine' as we want to distinguish the opportunities for coaches from places where bus service could be enhanced. As a Sub-National Transport Body we have no say over the development or management of interchanges. This would sit with the specific Local Authorities; whilst routes would sit with coach operators.

As you can imagine, our coach strategy is at a very early stage, and we do not yet know what this will look like. That is the purpose of gathering evidence and data to try and establish what is possible when it comes to coaches. Once we have developed the work we will publish the strategy on our website; we anticipate this being sometime in late autumn/winter this year.

Question 2.

What progress is being made on access for all schedules to station across South west England. Such schemes delayed at Torquay, Cheltenham spa and Weston super mare And support for new access for all bids at par Bodmin parkway ,castle cary ,Bridgwater, Nailsea and Backwell, Bedminster Parson street, Lawrence hill Stapleton road, Oidfiled park and Trowbridge, on First group Great western railway and Network rail western route .

At present we can even get Disabled access railing at Avonmouth and Bristol Stapleton road.

Bournemouth central ,Dorchester South

and yeovil junction. On First group MTR South western railway and Network rail Wessex routes. We have presently seen the worst of Network rail western route replace a Footbridge at Highbridge and Burnham on sea with a None disabled access Bridge without ramps and lifts. With a major Somerset rail head for buses and Taxis to Burnham, Brean and Berrow. Without discussion with disabled people or organisations or carrying out a diversity impact assessments.

What action is the Weston Gateway Transport Board and South west Transport Board taking to progress disabled access to Railway stations and interchanges in south west England with NETWORK Rail western and Wessex Routes First group Rail Great western railway and South western Railway

Local Transport Authorities and the Department for Transport.
